Executive Summary

The DAS-REMI is a data-driven accountability manual that provides a straightforward, measurable, transparent tool for assessing district performance in academic and non-academic areas. These objectives specify what the Superintendent and the administration will be focusing on to accomplish each of the Board’s strategic goals.

In accordance with Strategic Goal 2, the BOE Police Department shall provide a quarterly report that provides the number of Level III violations of weapons and drug offenses on school campuses by site. This report serves as the 2017-2018 summary for Level III violations. During the 2017-2018 school year (August 3, 2017 – May 18, 2018) there were twenty-two (22) weapon offenses in 16 separate schools; and fifty-one (51) drug offenses in 19 separate schools, respectively.

Current data from a three (3) year period establishes an average of thirty (30) weapons and fifty-nine (59) drug related incidents per school year. The goal is a reduction of each of these incidents

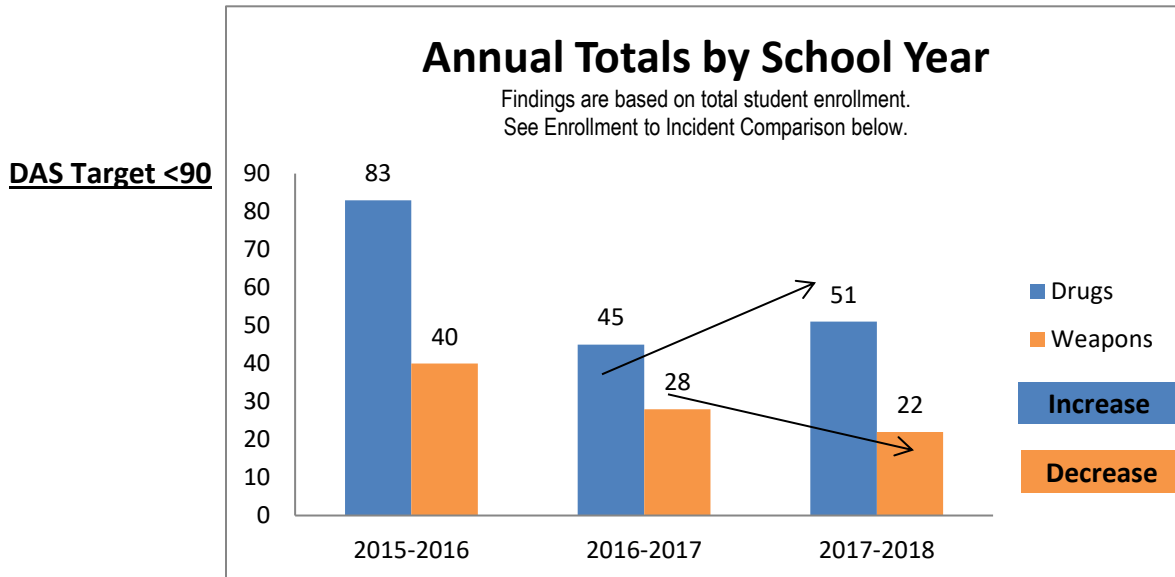
by 5% per quarter. As outlined in our 2017-2018 School Year report, there was a 21% decrease in the number of weapons and a 13% increase in the number of drug related incidents. Therefore, the 5% goal for weapons was achieved; however, the goal for drug incidents was not met.

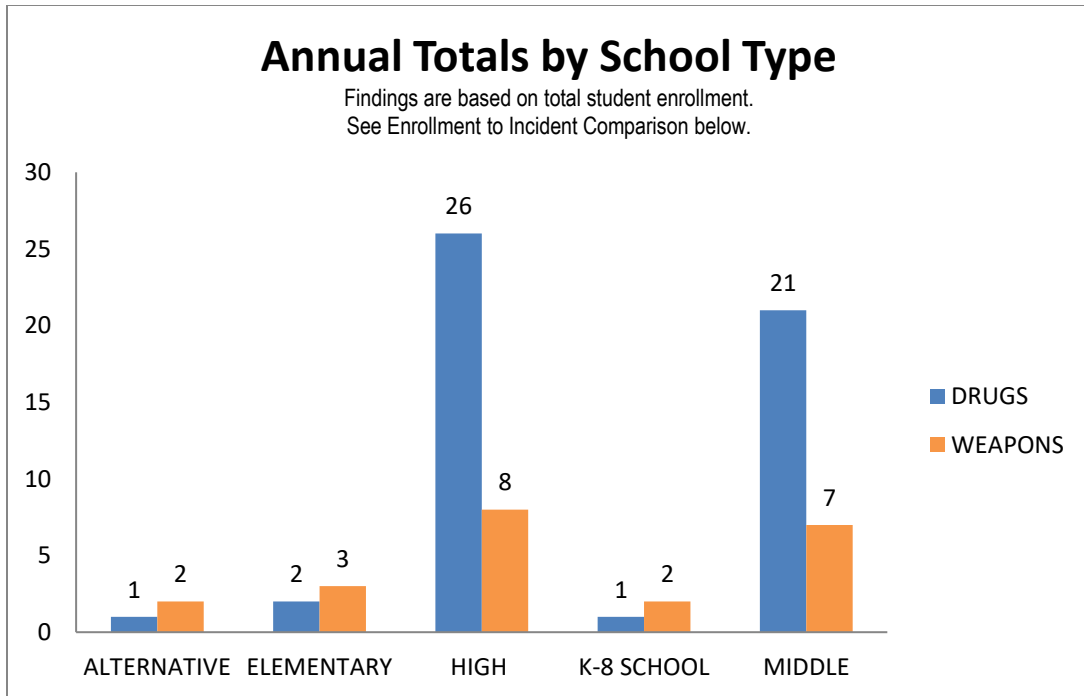

Provided below is a breakdown of weapons and drug violations in the last three (3), to include the 2016-2017 school year.



Also included are elementary, K-8, middle, high and alternative school incidents for the 2017-2018 school year. K-8 schools data reveals that two (2) weapons incidents were reported on the elementary grade level, and one (1) drug incident was reported at the middle school level. Enrollment to Incident Comparison

Less than one percent (1%) of reported incidents that occurred during the 2017-2018 School Year were committed by students enrolled. There were zero (0) incidences of Level III Violations involving repeat offenders.
