Executive Summary

The DAS-REMI is a data-driven accountability manual that provides a straightforward, measurable, transparent tool for assessing district performance in academic and non-academic areas. These objectives specify what the Superintendent and the administration will be focusing on to accomplish each of the Board's strategic goals.

In accordance with Strategic goal 2, the Board of Education Police Department shall provide a report that provides the number of District and School Crisis Exercises conducted. A District Wide Crisis Exercise involves more than 1 school with staff, students and district personnel. A School Crisis Exercise involves all staff and students at a particular site. For the 2015-2016 school year (July 2015 – June 2016), there were fifty two (52) tabletop (simulated) and fifty two (52) functional (live) school crisis exercises completed. There was one (1) functional (live) district wide crisis exercise completed during this reporting period. Thus, 100% of the schools have complied with the tabletop and 100% have complied with the functional exercises.
