Following a report on District Operations by Superintendent Dr. Ann Levett and a lengthy discussion of the need for more teachers willing to return to the classroom in person, the Board voted to move forward to offer an in-person hybrid option for all remaining grade levels to start on October 26th.

Board Workshop on ESPLOST IV

The Board's Informal Meeting WAS devoted to a workshop on planning for ESPLOST IV. Board members evaluated potential projects that could be included in an ESPLOST IV plan by looking at facility assessments, economic impact analysis, enrollment projections and revenue projections. The district is in year 4 of EPLOST III. ESPLOST IV, would be a continuation of the penny sales tax to fund school district construction, technology, safety and other projects. District Finance Division staff provided the Board with the Tentative Budget Calendar for Fiscal Year 2022. The tentative calendar calls for beginning enrollment projections in November, getting staff input, adopting legislative priorities in December and beginning staffing projections in January. Items of concern in the coming budget year include:

- State Budget/Austerity Reductions
- Modified Compensation Plan Year 4/5
- Cost Sharing (School Food Service, etc.)
- Continued Financial Stability
