

What is a Family-Parent School Compact?

It is a jointly developed written commitment describing how all members of a school community—families, teachers, principals, and students—agree to share responsibility for student learning. This compact helps bridge the learning connection between school and home.

How is it Revised?

Beach High School invited all families to attend our Annual Parent Forum to review, provide input, and revise this Family-Parent School Compact, as well as the school wide plan, our Family Policy and the familial involvement budget. Additionally, family feedback and comments regarding this compact are welcome during the school year through email or an online form under the “Title I” tab on the website (Beach.sccpss.com). The compact is posted on our school web site (by grade level) for families to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All family feedback received during the year will be used to revise the compact for the next school year. Families can also give feedback during family meetings and activities. Our Goals for Student Achievement

2022-2023 District Goals

To ensure all students are college and career ready; to provide a supportive learning environment that is conducive to teaching and learning; to maximize family and community engagement that contributes to the advancement of student success; to build professional capacity in order to achieve a premier student-focused workforce

School Goals

Increase the percentage of developing or higher learners from 54% to 59% on the American Lit Georgia Milestone Assessments (GMAS), from 38% to 41% on the Algebra 1 GMAS, from 47% to 52% on the Biology GMAS and from 49% to 54% on the US History GMAS by May 2023. Increase the percentage of students reading on/above Grade Level from 41% to 46% as measured by the American Lit Georgia Milestones Assessment by May 2023. Increase Graduation Rate from 71.6% to 74.6% by June of 2023.

School Will:

- Provide handbook / resource guide on how to use vocabulary in context for families
- Conduct Writing workshops for families in which ideas for the writing process are shared
- Model (show) and provide critical reading strategies resources during class as well as during parent conferences/workshops

Students Will:

- Use handbook / resource guide to study vocabulary at home
- Attend the writing workshops with family in order to be proficient in writing
- Use critical reading strategies as they prepare for tests/quizzes at home

Family Will:

- Review the vocabulary handbook / resource guide and assist their student at home
- Attend the writing workshops with their student to be able to assist at home
- Practice critical reading strategies with their student by providing additional reading materials at home

Building Accountable Scholars

School Will:

- Provide handbook / resource guide that contain examples of problems and solutions for Algebra 1
- Conduct parent workshops to demonstrate the math being taught in 9th grade
- Reinforce understanding and process of order of operations using flashcards

Students Will:

- Use the handbook / resource guide to complete math assignment and prepare for tests/quizzes
- Attend the workshops with the family to gain a deeper understanding of Algebra
- Practice understanding and process of order of operations using flashcards

Family Will:

- Work with their student using the handbook / resource guide
- Attend the workshop with their student to help them with their course work
- Reinforce by reviewing with my student on a weekly basis understanding and process of order of operations using flashcards
