Increase the percentage of developing or higher learners from 56% to 59% on the American Lit Georgia Milestone Assessments (GMAS), from 51% to 54% on the Algebra 1 GMAS, from 41% to 43% on the Biology GMAS and from 50% to 53% on the US History GMAS by May 2024. Increase the percentage of students reading on/above Grade Level from 45% to 49% as measured by the American Lit Georgia Milestones Assessment by May 2024. Increase Graduation Rate from 76.7% to 79.7% by June of 2024.
