What is Title I?

Garden City Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to challenging State academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support Family Engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents/families a written family engagement policy.

Title I Funds

Any Local Educational Agency (School District) with a Title I Allocation exceeding \$500,000 is required by law to set aside 1% of its Title I allocation for family engagement.

Shared Student Achievement by All

What is it?

This policy describes how Garden City Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parent/family engagement to support student learning. Garden City Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents/families in order to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This policy describes the different ways that Garden City Elementary will support parent/family engagement and how parents/families can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Garden City Elementary welcomes parent/family input and comments at any time regarding the policy. All parent/family feedback will be used to revise the policy for next year. The policy is posted on our school website for parents to view and post feedback throughout the year. We also distribute an annual survey to ask parents for their suggestions on the policy and the use of funds for family engagement.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Garden City Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English and parents with disabilities.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the policy is given to all students in their student handbook. The policy will also be posted on the school Web site. Parents/families can also retrieve a copy of the policy in the Parent Resource Center.

Garden City Elementary is Reaching Out!

Garden City Elementary will promote and support parents as an integral cornerstone of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will –

- ✓ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, and posted on the school website and included in the monthly school newsletter for all parents.
- ✓ Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of family engagement.
- ✓ Conduct staff development four times a year on family engagement practices and effective strategies for staff to communicate and build partnerships with parents/families.
- ✓ Partner with community programs to share school information about parent engagement activities that will help prepare parents and their child for school transition to Kindergarten and 6th grade.
- ✓ Share information in English and Spanish on the school website and in the school newsletter for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- ✓ Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school-wide events and activities, such as phone messages, and flyers.
- ✓ Provide necessary materials for parents at conferences, meetings, and workshops to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
