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What is a School Compact?

A school compact is a written agreement between a school, its parents and students. The compact gives strategies to help support students' success in school.

The compact explains what families and schools can do to make a connection for the student between the two "worlds" they live in, home and school.

Families were involved in the development of the compact through the Family Forum, surveys and feedback from meetings. This becomes the compact that is signed as an agreement by all those involved in the child's education.

How Will We Communicate?

It is very important for the school and parents to communicate on a regular basis in order to build the bridge between school and home. At Haven we will communicate by:

- ◆ Sending home communication folders
- ◆ Utilizing the school's "call-out" system to deliver messages.
- ◆ Planning parent/teacher conferences to update parents on student successes and areas of need and discussion of school compacts.
- ◆ Keeping the school website up to date.
- ◆ Informing parents about the ability to check on their child's grades through Power School
- ◆ Using communication apps: Remind and Class Dojo
- ◆ Teachers will make weekly phone calls, send text messages and emails to parents where necessary.

Teaming Up for Success: School, Parents, Students



School input in student success is the third leg of the success triangle. The school team and parents decided the following were needed from the school to help promote success:

- ◆ To support students in taking home reading material on their level and to supply weekly reading logs.
- ◆ Teacher will provide paper/pencil activities and simple games/tools to assist students with reading and math activities at school daily. (ex. using flashcards students will write sight words/simple facts matching activities.
- ◆ Send home sight words for parents and student to practice together. Include sight words in classroom learning stations and lessons.

Parents joined Haven staff to develop a list of actions to support student success.

- ◆ Read with your child for a minimum of 30 minutes every day.
- ◆ Parents will assist at home using flashcards and activities students created at school .
- ◆ Review sight words at home using sight word lists, spelling lists, and individual books.

Students play the biggest role in their own success. Haven Hornets gave ideas and feedback about what was important to them to be successful in school. Students gave the following ideas:

- ◆ I will read every day for a minimum of 30 minutes with an adult.
- ◆ I will practice my math and reading with materials from school made in class.
- ◆ I will review my sight words with an adult.
