## What Is a School Compact?

A school compact is a written agreement between a school, its parents and students. The compact gives strategies to help support students' success in school.

The compact explains what families and schools can do to make a connection for the student between the two "worlds" they live in, home and school.

Families were involved in the development of the compact through the Family Forum, surveys and feedback from meetings. This becomes the compact that is signed as an agreement by all those involved in the child's education.

## How Will We Communicate?

It is very important for the school and parents to communicate on a regular basis in order to build the bridge between school and home. At Haven we will communicate by:

- ◆ Sending home communication folders
- ◆ Utilizing the school's "call-out" system to deliver messages.
- ◆ Planning parent/teacher conferences to update parents on student successes and areas of need and discussion of school compacts.
- ◆ Keeping the school website up to date.
- ◆ Informing parents about the ability to check on their child's grades through Power School
- ◆ Using communication apps: Remind and Class Dojo
- ◆ Teachers will make weekly phone calls, send text messages and emails to parents when necessary.

## Teaming Up for Success: School, Parents, Students



**S**chool input in student success is the third leg of the success triangle. The school team and parents decided the following were needed from the school to help insure success:

- ◆ Send home reading passages or books on the student's reading level for home practice .
- ◆ Provide time to practice basic facts via computer or face to face practice in the classroom. Send home websites and resources that students can use to practice math facts.
- ◆ Support vocabulary development by providing in class activities and sending home vocabulary words and meaning to practice at

**P**arents joined Haven staff to develop a list of actions to support student success.

- ◆ Read with my child for 10-20 minutes per night with expression.
- ◆ Practice basic math facts to include addition, subtraction, multiplication and division with my child.
- ◆ Assist my child with learning vocabulary word meanings using the list sent home by teacher .

**S**tudents play the biggest role in their own success. Haven Hornets gave ideas and feedback about what was important to them to be successful in school. Fourth graders gave the following ideas:

- ◆ I will read with an adult 10-20 minutes per night with expression.
- ◆ I will practice my math facts (addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division) until I have memorized them using math flash cards.
- ◆ I will spend time daily working to learn the vocabulary words my teacher assigns to me using vocabulary lists my teacher gives me .
