


Music Choice Board for Third, Fourth, and Fifth Grades

There are eight activities here for you to choose.. Pick one at a time and then place an X in the box when you are done. Try to complete **three** of these activities by the end of the week.. <p>Practice note-writing using a paper and pencil. Copy each sign 10 times. Don't forget to shade in the notes that are not open!</p> 	<p>Share a song!</p> <p>Sing with your family! Teach your family a song we have learned in class. Ask your family members what they sang when they were your age, and sing that song together!</p>	<p>Go on a "sound walk" around your house or neighborhood. Take a pencil and paper with you, and draw or write what you hear. Think about how the sounds are different from our sound walk together at the beginning of the year. Challenge yourself and listen for opposites - what sounds are low/high? Steady beat/no beat? Loud/soft? Post your list to Dojo or email me!</p>
