- C. To provide flash cards and activities for parents to work on addition facts to 20.
- D. Students will practice reading and math skills using I Ready and Amira

White Bluff students joined staff and parents in developing ideas for their school success and soaring in math and reading. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- A. Students will read out a loud and answer questions about the text.

AT HOME
