### 2nd GRADE IN THE CLASSROOM

The 2nd grade classroom will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- A. To provide appropriate reading materials and a reading log to support reading at home.
- B. To provide resources to parents to increase student success with single digit addition and subtraction.
- C. To send home weekly skill sheets/HW for parents and students to use as practice.

### AT HOME

White Bluff parents joined staff in developing ideas for families to support students' success in reading and math. Families may have other ideas to add to this list.

- A. Parents will have their child read to them a minimum of 3 nights a week and document on the reading log.
- B. Parents and students will use provided resources to work on single digit addition facts and subtraction
- C. Parents will help their child reinforce weekly skills using the skill sheets /HW provided by the teacher.

### WHITE BLUFF STUDENTS

White Bluff students joined staff and parents in developing ideas for their school success and soaring in math and reading. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- A. Students will read to their parents 3 times a week .
- B. Student will use provided math materials to work on addition and subtraction
- C. Students will use the skill sheets/HW to incorporate skills in their conversations at home.
